WJEC CRIMINOLOGY:

TASKS

TASK 1: Use the website links to write a summary of theories on why the media portrays the information that it does. Can you find some specific examples which evidence these theories?

TASK 2: Watch the documentary about Mark Duggan. Write a summary of what factors you think led/contributed to his death.

TASK 3: Research the London Riots and Mark Duggan online. What further evidence can you to collect to explain what caused the London Riots/Mark's death and how the media represented crime in the example. (Remember to reference where you have collected information from)

TASK 4: Using a range of media sources (newspapers, TV, films, music, social media, video games) describe how crime is represented in the media. For example, if you only learnt about crime from listening to music, what would your understanding of crime be? Can you give specific examples to support your points?

TASK 5: Evaluate what factors contributed to the death of Mark Duggan. Use the documentary and your own wider research to complete this task.

TASK 6: Write an explanation of the causes of criminality using research to support your views.
