The College values the contribution that parents/carers can make towards their young person's education and would like to work in partnership with you to ensure that all of our young people can fulfil their potential. Therefore, we actively encourage parents/carers to contact the College and interact with teaching staff in order to ensure that all of our young people have the opportunity to be successful during their time with us.

## AS A VALUED PARENT/(ARER, YOU WILL BE:


- TREATED WITH RESPECT; you are seen as a valued partner in your young person's education.
- (ONTACTED BY TEA(HING STAFF or your young person's Progress Coach if there are concerns over your young person's attendance, punctuality, behaviour or progress.
- EN(ovraged To contact your young PERSON'S PROGRESS (OACH, should you wish to discuss any issues or problems. Their name will be available on CEDAR.
- 4 REPRESENTED ON THE (OLLEGE'S LO(AL GOVERNING BODY BY PARENT GOVERNORS.

## THE COLLEGE EXPECTS YOU AS A PARENT/CARER TO:

- 1 ASK YOUR YOUNG PERSON ABOUT THEIR STUDIES ON A REGULAR BASIS and discuss any issues which might impact on their progress with them and College staff when relevant. Your first point of contact is your young person's Progress Coach. Their name will be available on CEDAR.
- SUPPORT YOUR YOUNG PERSON TO ACHIEVE THEIR POTENTIAL by encouraging them to attend all lessons, ASPIRE tutorials and ASPIRE+ activities on time; and to complete all PREP work after each lesson by the deadlines set.
- 3 EN(OVRAGE YOVR YOVNG PERSON TO TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR STUDIES by coming to College fully equipped and ready to learn (e.g. pen, paper, folder, if available their own fully charged electronic device etc.).
- LOG ON TO THE (EDAR PARENT PORTAL REGULARLY, and before Parents'/Carers' Evening appointments, in order to access information on your young person's attendance and progress. The link to access this can be found in the Parents' and Carers' section of the College website.

- 5 ATTEND (OLLEGE EVENTS IN(LVDING ONE PARENTS'/(ARERS' EVENING during each academic year.
- AVOID BOOKING HOLIDAYS DURING TERM TIME and ensure that non-urgent medical appointments, driving lessons/tests and other non-urgent appointments are made outside of lesson times.
- 7 SUPPORT YOUR YOUNG PERSON TO INFORM THE COLLEGE OF ANY CHANGE IN CONTACT DETAILS, including a change of address, telephone number or email address.
- 8 EN(OVRAGE YOVR YOVNG PERSON TO TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR SOVR(ING A WORK EXPERIEN(E PLA(EMENT that is relevant to their programme of study (support is available in College should they require help to do this), and help them to engage in actively researching future career plans.

- 4 AN INVITATION TO A PARENTS'/(ARERS' EVENING IN THE AUTUMN OR SPRING TERM and to be provided with the opportunity to speak with subject teachers to discuss your young person's progress.

- AN INVITATION TO THE PROGRESSION EVENING IN THE SUMMER TERM which will include information on the UCAS application process, issues relating to finance and higher education, degree apprenticeships, and other progression destinations.
- 6 INFORMATION ON EXAM ARRANGEMENTS.
- 6 A RESPONSE TO ANY ENQUIRY WITHIN 5 COLLEGE WORKING DAYS.
